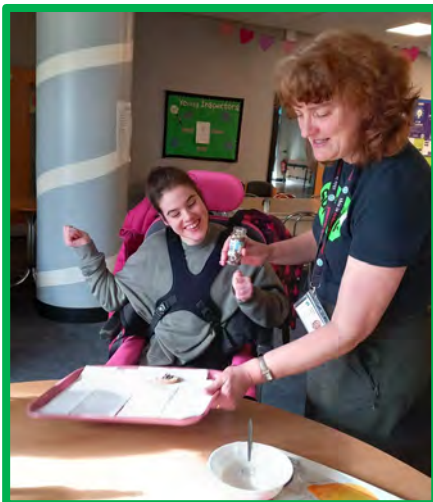

SHORT BREAKS CLUB INFORMATION

Eligibility	<p>The clubs are available for Redcar and Cleveland Children and Young People who have Special Educational Needs and/or a Disability. These clubs are self-referral, families do not need a social worker referral or diagnosis to access the sessions.</p> <p>The clubs enable children and young people to create new friendships, to take part in new experiences and have fun doing positive activities. As children and young people will be cared for while accessing the clubs this enables parent carers to have a necessary and valuable break from their caring responsibilities, a chance to rest and unwind and spend time with other members of the family.</p>
Age range	<p>The clubs are available for children and young people aged 5 years up to their 18th birthday.</p> <p><u>Babies up to 5 years</u></p> <p>The Short Breaks Team have a separate activities leaflet for this age range, please visit the Short Breaks webpage (details in the contact section) to obtain a copy.</p> <p><u>Young People 18-25 years</u></p> <p>The clubs will support young people and their families to sign post to Adult social activities ahead of turning 18. In exceptional circumstances, young people may be able to continue attending the clubs beyond their 18th birthday. A request by the club will need to be made to the Local Authority to request this. Staff Training	<p>As a minimum, staff working in our clubs will have undertaken training in the following areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medication administration • First aid • Equality and diversity • Learning disabilities • Positive behaviour support • Health and safety • Communication training • Epilepsy • Children's safeguarding • Neurodiversity • Physical disabilities • Online safety • Food hygiene • Safeguarding children with disabilities

	In addition to the minimum training each provider will have their own mandatory staff training for these sessions. If a child or young person requires specific training to support their needs, please discuss with the club provider or Redcar and Cleveland's Short Breaks Team.
Staffing ratios	Staffing in clubs ranges from 1 member of staff supporting 4 children up to 1 to 1 support. The staffing ratios for each club will be outlined in the club information section.
Induction/visits	<p>If you are unsure which club would be suitable, you are welcome to arrange visits with the clubs before making a decision. Please contact the individual clubs to arrange.</p> <p>Children and young people and their parents can often be nervous and anxious about attending a new club – this is completely understandable. The clubs will support parents and children until they feel comfortable in the sessions.</p>
Assessments/ care plans	Each club will undertake an assessment to create an individualised care plan. Parents should ensure any changes in care or support needs are shared with the club leader as soon as possible. If children have their own support plan, EHCP or PBS plan please feel free to share these with the club.
Children attending with their own PA/Worker	Some children and young people will have their own dedicated Personal Assistant or Direct Payment Worker which has been allocated via a Social Care Assessment. If a child/young person would prefer to attend the clubs with their own worker, either for a short induction period or as their regular support at the sessions this is permitted, however, suitability of the club would still need to be assessed by the club leader and parents.
Transport	<p>For the majority of clubs, parents are required to take children to and from the sessions.</p> <p>If a child or young person would be unable to attend a club due to lack of transport, the Local Authority may be able to provide support with this. Each request for transport will be assessed on an individual basis. Families should discuss requirements with the club leader.</p>
Sibling Offer	A number of the clubs will provide regular or dedicated sessions where siblings, who do not have SEND and are of a similar age can also attend the clubs. Please contact individual clubs about their sibling offer.
Concerns about a club	We expect the clubs to be a positive experience for families, however, if you do have any concerns or feedback about a club, these should initially be raised and discussed with the club as they have their own processes to follow.
