We appreciate how hard the festive season can be for our families and how the change of routine can impact our children. We have detailed some support services below for families where you can reach out for support during this period.

Daisy Chain Family Support Service

If you live in the Tees Valley, the Family Support Service, delivered by Daisy Chain, is here for you. The team supports the families of young people aged 0-18 years, no matter where they are on their Autistic, ADHD, Sensory Processing or Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) journey. This means that your young person does not need to have a diagnosis or be on the neurodevelopmental pathway to access support from the service. The Family Support Service is here to listen to your concerns and offer you support

Single Point of Contact (SPOC)

In Redcar, the Single Point of Contact (SPOC) for mental health services is managed by Tees Esk and Wear Valley NHS Trust. You can contact the SPOC by calling 0300 013 2000 and selecting Option 2 if you live in Redcar. For more information, you can also reach out via email at tewv.stspoc-camhs@nhs.net.

We have also listed below some strategies and tips that can help during this period:-

- Create a Visual Schedule: Use a visual timetable or calendar to show what's happening each day, helping your child stay organized and reduce anxiety.
- Prepare for Changes: Keep regular bedtimes and mealtimes consistent, and give plenty of notice if plans change.
- Involvement in Decorations: Involve your child in decorating to make them feel part of the process and more in control.
- Sensory-Friendly Environment: Use soft lighting, calming music, and offer sensory-friendly activities to create a peaceful space.
- Inclusive Festivities: Plan activities that can be enjoyed by everyone and be open to modifications.
- Communication: Share your child's needs and sensitivities with relatives and friends to create a supportive atmosphere.
- By embracing flexibility, creating a sensory-friendly environment, and planning inclusive festivities, you can help your child enjoy the festive season with ease. Remember, it's okay to have a different Christmas than what others might have, and it's more important to focus on what makes your family happy

We are also available over the Christmas Holidays in the support Group and Facebook Group. Please bare in mind, it may take us a little longer to respond to messages whilst we also have our own families to look after.

We wish all our families a lovely Christmas and best wishes for 2026. Whatever your plans are or how you celebrate, if it works for your family - roll with it.

Parent Carer Feedback

Starting January we are going to be putting out a simple survey every 3 months which will consist of 3 questions that parent and carers can answer anonymously. This will hopefully be another way parents can feedback their issues quickly and anonymously. We will still have the Your Voice function on the website to submit any specific concerns or issues to us that can be forwarded to the relevant professionals to be actioned.

It's very easy to take part. Simply pick up a challenge card from your local Family Hub or library or download it from the council website and start ticking off the nine fun, straightforward tasks.

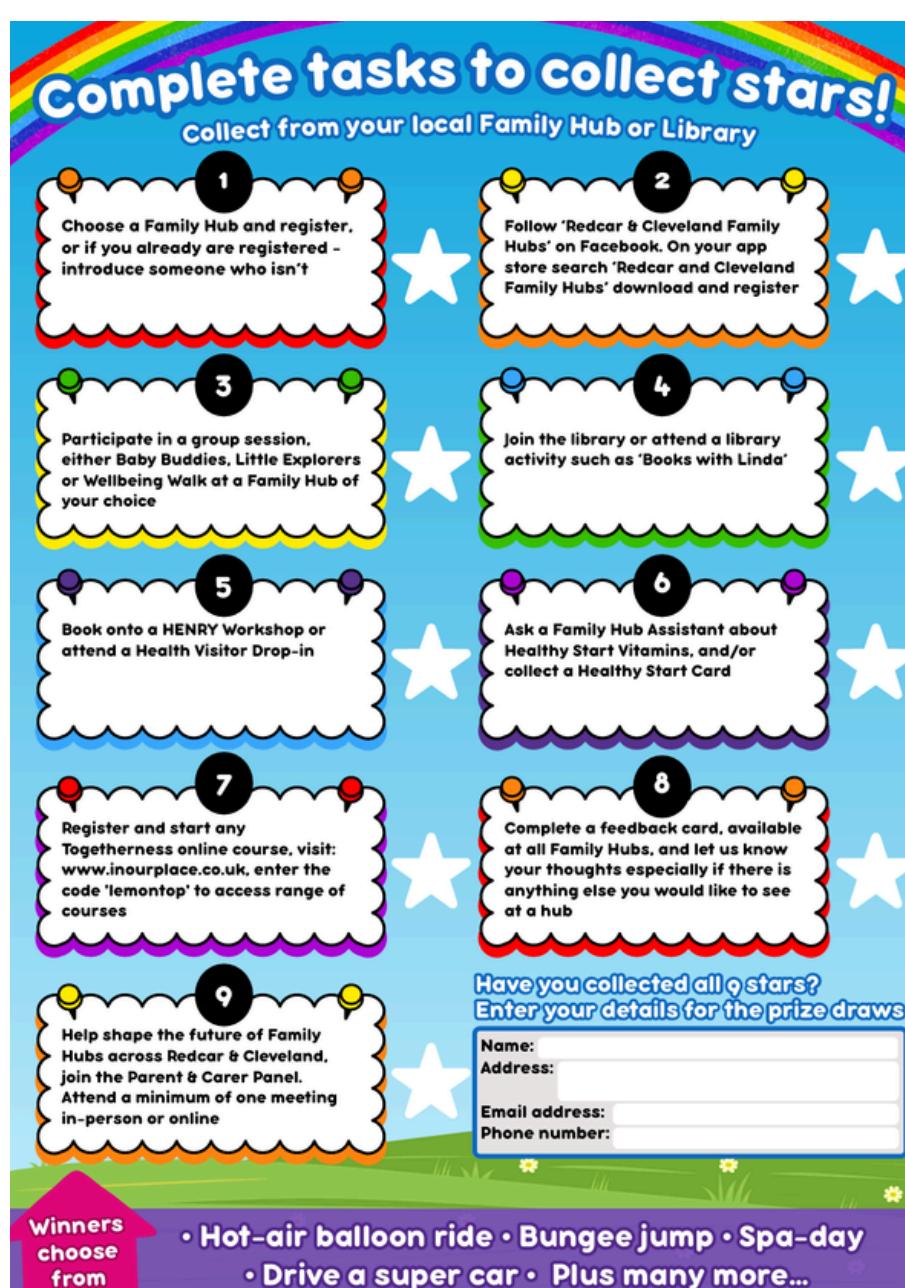
It starts on Monday 17 November and the nine tasks must be completed by 31 March next year.

The nine tasks must be completed by 31 March next year and verified by council staff at a Hub or library. To take part you must be 18 or over and live in Redcar and Cleveland. There will be three prize draws on Friday 30 January, Friday 21 February and Tuesday 31 March.

Redcar and Cleveland Early Years SEND Team

The Early Years Area SENDCo coordinates the support provided by the Early Years SEND Practitioners, who were previously known as and sometimes still referred to as Portage. The team support children who have a significant delay in two or more areas of their development, from birth to school age. To access the Early Years Practitioners, SENDCO's should complete a Family Hubs Referral form

Redcar and Cleveland SEN department

The SEND Team is responsible for Education, Health, and Care Needs Assessments (working in collaboration with the family, child or young person and professionals). They also manage the placement and provision for children with Education, Health, Care Plan (EHCP) as well as annual reviews. The SEND team consists of a Statutory SEND Manager, SEND Lead Officers, PfA Coordinator, SEND Officers, Independent Travel Trainers, SEND Business and Data Officer and the SEND administration team.

- continuing education, training or getting a job
- living independently
- having friends and being part of the local community
- being as healthy as possible.

Short Breaks

Short Breaks are available for children and young people with special educational needs and or disabilities aged 0 - 18 years, some support may extend up to 25 years where there is an assessed need for the service to remain in place.
